The regular Chase County Commissioner meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 27, 2022 by the Chairman. The memorial was discussed. They indicated that the statue has to be re-bronzed. The wrong chemical was used when they had it blasted to remove the water stains and it took off the bronzing. Duane and Bud left the meeting.

At 9:00 a.m. Heidi Wheeler with Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department joined the meeting. Heidi gave a brief update for 2021. Heidi left the meeting at 9:15 a.m.

Duane Dinnel moved to approve the minutes of the September 13th meeting. Dennis Kunnemann seconded. Duane-yes; Dennis-yes; Jacci-yes; motion carried.

Dennis Kunnemann moved to approve the minutes of the September 13th public hearing of the budget. Duane Dinnel seconded. Dennis-yes; Duane-yes; Jacci-yes; motion carried.

Road wages were discussed. The resolution currently in affect will be updated and voted on at the next board meeting.

The meeting recessed at 9:30 a.m. for a Board of Equalization meeting.

The meeting reconvened at 9:40 a.m. with all members present.

Fuel purchasing was discussed. A fuel tank for the Lamar shop will be revisited.

The board reviewed the list of county buildings and vehicles receiving hail damage earlier this year. We need to look into alternatives for the courthouse roof.

Jacci Brown moved to approve the application by Wardcraft Homes for a house moving permit. Dennis Kunnemann seconded. Jacci-yes; Dennis-yes; Duane-yes; motion carried.

Copies of the County audit report prepared by Don Wilson had been provided to the board. Duane Dinnel moved to approve the audit report. Jacci Brown seconded. Duane-yes; Jacci-yes; Dennis-yes; motion carried. A copy of the audit report is available in the office of the County Clerk.

A copy of the budget message as prepared by the Clerk was presented for board approval and signature. Jacci Brown moved to approve the budget message. Duane Dinnel seconded. Jacci-yes; Duane-yes; Dennis-yes; motion carried. The budget will be uploaded to the State this week.

The notice of storage appropriations for Champion Mill Lake was reviewed. Imperial Community Center minutes for August were reviewed.

Duane Dinnel moved to go into closed session to consult with legal counsel concerning the TERC hearing. Jacci Brown seconded. Duane-yes; Jacci-yes; Dennis-yes; motion carried. The three commissioners and deputy county attorney Rory Roundtree entered into closed session at 10:20 a.m. concerning the TERC hearing.

The county clerk was summoned back to the meeting at 10:43 a.m. and the meeting resumed. No actions were taken.

Inventory sheets were presented for the board's review. The board affixed their signature stamps to them.

Assessor Bartels reported that \$3546.00 is being held by GIS for data sales. The board indicated they should send the funds to the Treasurer. They were not interested in any additional GIS layers.

List of 2022 building permits issued was reviewed.

Jacci Brown moved to surplus the stethoscopes and DeWalt chargers. The stethoscopes have been misplaced and unable to locate. The chargers are for old cots no longer in use and are outdated. Duane Dinnel seconded. Jacci-yes; Duane-yes; Dennis-yes; motion carried. Items may be trashed.

Dennis Kunnemann moved to surplus the two old Wauneta cots that were traded for the new power cots. Duane Dinnel seconded. Dennis-yes; Duane-yes; Jacci-yes; motion carried. These were never removed from inventory sheets.

Jacci Brown moved to surplus the glucometer that no longer works. Dennis Kunnemann seconded. Jacci-yes; Dennis-yes; Duane-yes; motion carried. The item may be trashed.

Dennis Kunnemann moved to surplus the 2016 Dyson vacuum (county tag #983) that is in pieces in the custodian closet. Duane Dinnel seconded. Dennis-yes; Duane-yes; Jacci-yes; motion carried.

Jacci Brown moved to surplus the old Imperial cots that were traded for the new power cots. Duane Dinnel seconded. Jacci-yes; Duane-yes; Dennis-yes; motion carried. These were never removed from the inventory sheets.
