Chase County Commissioners September 23, 2025

At 8:00am on Tuesday, September 23, 2025, Chairman Jacci Brown opened the Special Hearing to set Final Tax Request in the meeting room of the Chase County Courthouse. Notice of the Tax Request Hearing was published in the Imperial Republican on September 18, 2025. Three copies of the budget were available for public inspection. Also present were Commissioners Billie Muehlenkamp and Kurt Bernhardt, County Attorney Joel Burke and County Clerk Wendy Moe.

At 8:15am Chairman Jacci Brown closed the tax request hearing and opened the Budget Hearing. Notice of the Budget hearing was published in the Imperial Republican on September 18, 2025. Three copies of the budget were available for public inspection. Sheriff Mueller joined the meeting. With no members of the public present to offer comment and no questions or comments from elected officials, Chairman Brown closed the Budget Hearing at 8:25.

Upon the conclusion of the budget hearing, the board commenced into the regular meeting of the Chase County Commissioners. The meeting had been advertised in the Imperial Republican and on the County Website. The agenda and open meeting act were posted.

Commissioner Brown moved to approve Resolution 2025-17, for the adoption of the 2025-2026 Budget Document. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to approve Resolution 2025-18 for the 2025-2026 Property Tax Request. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to approve claims as submitted. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Muehlenkamp moved to approve the minutes of the September 9, 2025, meeting as written. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to approve Resolution 2025-19 for Ambulance Debt Cancellation in the amount of \$38,929.73. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to approve Resolution 2025-20 for Ambulance Debt Cancellation in the amount of \$81,428.68. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Mike Liewer, Stephen Mulder and Justin Davis, members of the Imperial Eagles and Ryan Stromberger and Jake Burke, Chase County Fair Board members, joined the meeting for discussion of the Eagles booth. It was agreed by all present that the roof needs to be inspected further for structural damage before any spray foam is applied. Eagles own all equipment inside the building. County owns the building. Both parties agree to a 5-year rental agreement for \$1500 annually. Rent will be paid to the Fair Board. It will be a general rental agreement; structure will be the responsibility of the Fair Board/County. Equipment inside will be maintained by the Eagles. Fair Board will consult with County Attorney to have the agreement drawn up.

Commissioners spoke to Jake and Ryan concerning the auditor's findings, reiterated that the accounts all need to be reconciled in a timely manner, and that they recommend the fair board

retains a professional bookkeeper to maintain their accounts. Jake indicated that they already consult with a professional firm and would continue to do so.

Commissioners also noted that a Fair Board member should be in charge of all contracts and take lead on communications with vendors, etc. Associate members may assist in these things, but ultimately a Board Member needs to be the lead point of contact.

Chairman Brown had to leave the meeting at 9:30, meeting was turned over to Vice-Chair Kurt Bernhardt.

Commissioners noted that they do not wish to change the current arrangements with DHHS office space, agreement will remain as it has been.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to approve the quote from CSI for striping to be done on six miles of Champion Highway, for \$7,800, to be done along with the 2.8 miles of 331 avenue, as previously approved. Work must be completed on or before October 15, or wait until Spring of 2026. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – absent; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Correspondence was reviewed, consisting of July and August minutes from the Imperial Community Center and the monthly ambulance billing report from the ambulance administrator.

Commissioner Muehlenkamp moved to sign the Barrow Lease Agreement between the County and Berneice Fanning for the pit located on the W1/2 of 12-6-37. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – absent; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Treasurer Rebecca Bernard was present to notify the Board of delinquent taxes and provide a resolution to issue tax sale certificates for their consideration. Commissioner Bernhardt moved to approve Resolution 2025-21, to Issue Tax Sale Certificates in the Name of the County. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – absent; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to advertise for formal bids for the Courthouse Front Step project, to be open on October 14, 2025, at 8:30am. Motion seconded by Commissioner Muehlenkamp. Muehlenkamp – yes; Brown – absent; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

It was discussed and decided that due to the November 11 Veterans Day Holiday, the first November meeting will be held on Monday, November 10, 2025.

Leanne Klein joined the meeting for Open Forum to present the quarterly report on behalf of Wauneta EMS.

With no further business to come before the Board, Vice Chairman Bernhardt adjourned the meeting at 9:43am.
